In this event, experts from diverse linguistic backgrounds will discuss various aspects of multilingualism and linguistic diversity. The discussions will include interventions in German, Italian, and Spanish, with our interpreting trainees providing real-time interpretation into English using modern interpreting lab equipment resembling that of European institutions. Attendees will also have the opportunity to learn about the work of the Translation and Interpreting program at the University of Essex. 2:15pm Linguistics Taster - Computational Linguistics

In this session, we will have students participate in a few brief sample computer-based experiments on speech perception and word recognition, show them graphs of their data, explain what it means, and ask for their own thoughts on various factors that could have influenced the results. We will also demo a couple of specialist devices we use for experimentation: eye tracking (where we track a person's eye movements on a screen as they are performing a language task) and EEG (where we record a person's brain signals as they read or hear different language structures). Finally, we will demo some computational/Al systems (such as automated speech recognition, like Siri or Alexa; and dialogue systems like ChatGPT) and discuss ways linguists are working to improve them.
